In March this year soon after the first cases of Covid-19 were diagnosed in Ireland the government made a decision to close schools and universities. Almost overnight classes and all teaching went online and for the remaining part of the semester students completed their learning, assessments and examinations online. This situation was similar in many universities around the world. However now, with a

marked decrease in the number of new cases, restrictions have begun to ease and a phased reopening over the coming weeks has been outlined by the government.

In Trinity we are also planning all aspects of the coming academic year ensuring that all public health guidelines are met in order to welcome exchange students back on campus safely. In terms of teaching we will be providing a hybrid model, where large lectures will be online and small group teaching, tutorials and laboratory classes will be in person as much as possible. We acknowledge that social distancing will be part of the way we live for the coming year and we are preparing the campus to enable this. However, in as much as possible we want to ensure that the clubs and societies can continue to operate while always adhering to public health guidelines.

On behalf of all here at Trinity College Dublin, I hope that you and your family, loved ones and colleagues remain healthy, safe and well.

Key Updates

- ▶ We are delighted to announce that the GPA requirement for incoming exchange students has now been changed from 3.3 to 3.1 with immediate effect. Please note that very few individual areas of study may have different requirements. E.g. Economics and Philosophy require a 3.5 GPA and Political Science specify a 3.3. - ➤ Trinity has formally approved an additional option for incoming exchange students for 2020 to prove English language proficiency where relevant, using Duolingo. Students must attain a minimum overall score of 110/160, dated since January 2020. In addition, IELTS, TOEFL iBT, PTE and Cambridge tests will be accepted for 3 years after the date of the exam instead of 2 years.
- ➤ As of December 2019, Trinity's student exchange partner universities that offer three-year degree programmes can now nominate students to join Trinity's exchange programme for the second year of studies.

- ▶ Please note that our colleague Sean O'Brien has now moved departments within Trinity and incoming applications will now be processed by Natalie Baldwin. Further information can be found in the Application section below.
- ➤ Trinity have made the decision to allow our students to embark on an exchange and also to welcome exchange students on our campus where this is permitted by the partner university for the Fall and Spring semesters.



The Lir

Modules at The Lir, National Academy of Dramatic Art are now available to exchange students, but students cannot cross-register in other Schools/Departments if taking modules at the Lir due to scheduling.

Schools and Departments noted with an asterisk () are particularly in demand, so early applications are recommended.

Credit

Students typically take 30 ECTS per semester at Trinity. ECTS (European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System) is a credit weighting, so the number of modules (classes) a student takes at Trinity varies on the credit values for each of their modules, which usually have a 5, 10 or 15 ECTS value. Students must take a minimum of 20 ECTS in a semester and 45 ECTS for the academic year. Students are encouraged to also check in with their home universities for credit load requirements.

All visiting undergraduates are provided with a Tutor who is available to assist with any academic or personal issues or concerns. The Office of Student Learning and Development is also available to help with any academic concerns: **student-learning.tcd.ie**. INIS Information	All students who do NOT hold an EU passport must register with the Irish Naturalisation and Immigration Service (INIS) after arrival in Ireland. Housing and Accommodation

Costs and Insurance

Estimated Living Costs	Housing: Trinity-approved accommodation options include Binary Hub and Kavanagh Court. 2019/2020 Binary Hub rates are €4,940 for Semester 1 and €5,200 for Semester 2, with a full year rate of €10,200. Unfortunately, Campus Housing is very limited and as a result not available (however, if you have a student with mobility needs, etc. please let us know.) We will provide links to Trinity's Student Union Accommodation Advice for any student interested in living in alternate accommodation options but are not able to assist students in procuring accommodation outside of the approved options. Insurance	Students arriving from outside of the EU should contact their health insurance provider to determine if they are covered while studying abroad and if not they will need either to arrange health insurance prior to departure or purchase insurance locally in Ireland. Private health insurance cover is mandatory for non-EU students in order to register with the Irish Naturalisation and Immigration Service (INIS). Students often use university plans or study abroad plans recommended by the home university, but must confirm that their plan meets immigration requirements.
