


#### Sophia-Nanzan

# Late August Pre-sessional



This program is a one-month Intensive Elementary Japanese course which helps students strengthen Japanese communication skills in daily life in Japan and prepare to participate in a one- or two-semester undergraduate or graduate programs at Sophia University. Students will learn not only language but also Japanese culture and society. Upon completion of this course, students are expected to be able to cope with basic daily and specific matters in various situations in Japan, such as greetings, self-introductions, going shopping, etc. Students should become able to read and write hiragana and katakana (syllabic Japanese scripts) and some useful kanji (Chinese characters).

Intensive Elementary Japanese (IEJ) 90 min. × 30 times , 3 weeks)

Japanese for Communication Japanese for Reading and Writing Conversation with Japanese Students

There is a possibility the program could be cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.


## PAYMENT
